We lay there & looked up at the night sky & she told me about stars called blue squares & red swirls & I told her I'd never heard of them.

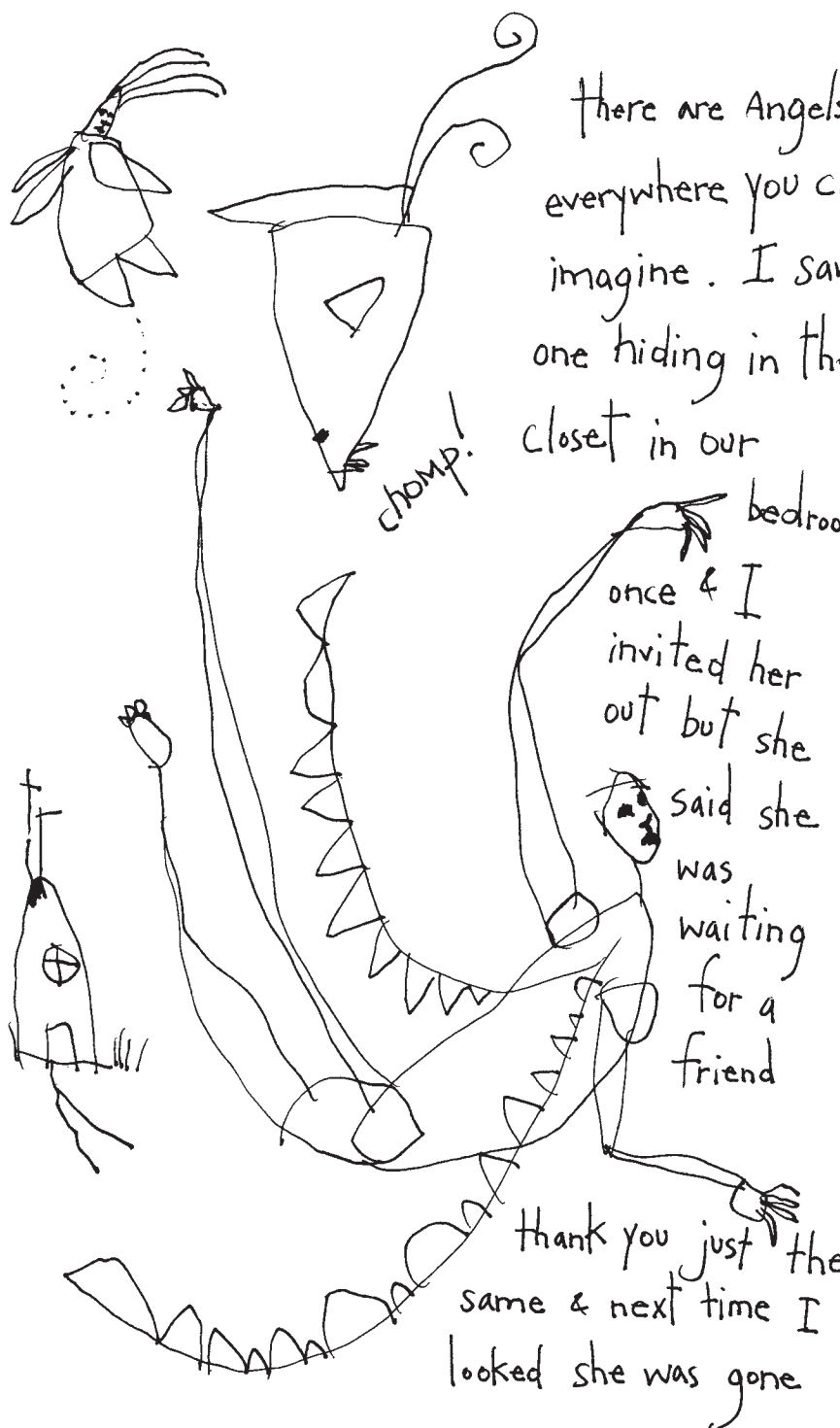
Of course not, she said, the really important stuff they never tell you. You have to imagine it on your own.
